A BILL

To require a report on expanding the scope of jurisdiction under the terrorism exception to the Foreign Sovereign Immunities Act in cases where a terrorist attack resulted in injury but no death.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Justice for Veterans
5 and Victims of Terrorism Act of 2026”.

1 **SEC. 2. STUDY.**

2 Not later than December 31, 2028, the Comptroller
3 General of the United States shall complete a study, and
4 submit a report thereon to Congress, that considers the
5 following:

6 (1) How many additional individuals would be
7 eligible for payments if the scope of the exemption
8 under section 1605A(a)(1) of title 28, United States
9 Code (commonly referred to as the “Foreign Sov-
10 ereign Immunities Act”) was expanded to include in-
11 dividuals who are victims of attempted extrajudicial
12 killings or assaults.

13 (2) How much additional funding would be re-
14 quired for payments referred to under paragraph
15 (1).

16 (3) What legislative amendments would best ac-
17 complish the inclusion referred to in paragraph (1),
18 including individuals who suffered psychiatric inju-
19 ries.

20 (4) A listing of all funds and the net proceeds
21 from the sale of property, forfeited or paid to the
22 United States since December 18, 2015 arising from
23 a violation (civil or criminal) of any license, order,
24 regulation or prohibition issued under the Inter-
25 national Emergency Economic Powers Act.

1 (5) A listing of all funds and the net proceeds
2 from the sale of property, forfeited or paid to the
3 United States since December 18, 2015 arising from
4 a violation (civil or criminal) of any license, order,
5 regulation or prohibition issued under the Trading
6 with the Enemy Act of 1917.

7 (6) A listing of all funds and the net proceeds
8 from the sale of property, forfeited or paid to the
9 United States since December 18, 2015 arising from
10 any conspiracy, scheme, or other Federal offense
11 (civil or criminal) arising from the actions of, or
12 doing business with or acting on behalf of, a state
13 sponsor of terrorism.

14 (7) A listing of all funds and net proceeds from
15 property sales forfeited or paid to the United States
16 since December 18, 2015, that exceeded \$5,000,000
17 in value, and including sufficient information to
18 identify the source (including case name and
19 amount), except that, to the extent publication of
20 such information is limited, the listing shall include
21 information sufficient to identify the violations
22 charged, the amounts forfeited or paid, and the
23 dates of such forfeiture or payment.

24 (8) A listing of all funds and net proceeds from
25 property sales forfeited or paid to the United States

1 since December 18, 2015, that exceeded \$5,000,000
2 in value, and including sufficient information to
3 identify the source (including case name and
4 amount), except that, to the extent publication of
5 such information is limited, the listing shall include
6 information sufficient to identify the violations
7 charged, the amounts forfeited or paid, and the
8 dates of such forfeiture or payment.

9 (9) An accounting of any interest earned on the
10 aforementioned criminal or civil penalties.
